Our Future

As the school continues to evolve and grow our teaching is informed by the latest research and developments in education.

Springfield is becoming a restorative school community with a focus on affective language and emotional intelligence.

The aging buildings will be replaced with a state-of-the-art new build as the school will be redeveloped commencing in 2024.

The new build will secure a school for the children of Kallaroo well into the future. New buildings will be enhanced with new play and outdoor learning spaces to ensure Springfield Primary School remains an active learning environment, where children develop critical and creative thinking both in and outside the classroom.

Our Past

Established in 1972 Springfield Primary School was the first school opened to support the rapid expansion of the northern suburbs of Kallaroo, Craigie and Hillarys.

In its first year Springfield grew exponentially and during the 70's, 80's and 90's Springfield was at the heart of the education of many young families.

Community aspirations were high and the school built a reputation as a school of excellence. During the early 2000s the school was recognised for the excellent teaching and learning winning a National Excellence in School Improvement Award.

Pastoral care developed as a strength and the school motto evolved from 'Striving for excellence' into 'Working Together Achieving More', when the school became an Independent Public School in 2015.

Embed the authentic use of student voice through Real Schools Circles

Continue to refine and improve the Student Leadership model to offer all senior students authentic leadership opportunities

Embed whole school approaches to teaching and learning that ensure consistency of practise

Use evidence and research to inform the development of a pedagogical framework in our Connected Learning Handbook, based on Teaching for Impact

Utilise data to inform targeted teaching programs

Allocate physical and financial resources to ensure maximum impact on student learning

Ensure timely review of whole school approaches and support any changes with an appropriate change management strategy

Continue to engage with the Joondalup Learning Community Future Leaders Program to identify and support high potential future leaders through high quality professional learning and mentorship

Implement a video coaching framework that supports deep self-reflection and personal growth

Align the Workforce Plan to ensure the attraction and development of highly skilled staff to implement our pedagogical framework

Refine and improve staff induction processes

WE WILL:

Build a restorative school community in partnership with Real Schools

Streamline communication processes between home and school

Develop a Parent Partnership Framework outlining roles and responsibilities to support our motto of 'Working Together, Achieving More'

Establish a RAP working group to commence the process of developing a Reconciliation Action Plan

Continue to partner with local providers to offer opportunities for students E.G. City of Joondalup, Story Dogs, Local Politicians, Perth Royal Show, Hillarys Out of School Hours Care (HOOSCI)

Support the school community through the redevelopment process to allow for the rebuild of Springfield Primary School to provide a State-of-the-Art Learning Environment for the future

Continue to partner with Joondalup Learning Community to create opportunities for staff, students and families

Embed a strong student services team to support students and families with physical and mental health and well-being

Ensure strong governance and support continues with a well-trained school board who can advise and support school decision making processes

Continue to work closely with Parents & Citizens Association (P & C) to fundraise and hold events which support the school community

Teaching for Impact

Teaching for Impact is part of the Quality Teaching Strategy. It guides schools to focus on the elements that have the biggest impact on student wellbeing and achievement.

Joondalup Learning Community

The school network that Springfield Primary School belongs to. Networks of schools use system resources and connected supports to share and discuss student achievement information, common resources and tools focussed on improving student achievement.

Future Leaders

potential future leaders.

Differentiation

Adapting or adjusting learning experiences to meet the needs of individual or groups of students.

MiniLit

An evidence based, explicit and effective early literacy intervention program for teaching children in the bottom 25% of the expected range for their age in Year 1 and 2.

PEAC

Primary Extension and Challenge Program (All children are tested in Year 4 to identify eligible students for PEAC courses.)

Elastik

Elastik is a platform that allows teachers to pinpoint and address unidentified gaps in students' learning in Maths, English and Science.

STEM

An approach to integrating Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths.

Real Schools

Real Schools is a partnership involving professional learning, mentoring and coaching for staff to develop a restorative school culture.
